### Pastor Reflections:

It's Easter! Christ is Risen! And that's no April Fools!

To conclude our Lenten journey, I wanted to share the last reflection from our Foolish Love Bible Study guide. The following is an excerpt from "Foolish Love is the Hope of Easter."

"If there was ever a story that was hard to explain, it is Easter. It defies everything we know. People do not die and then raise up three days later. We are talking nonsense. What kind of story are we trying to tell here anyway? It feels like an April Fools joke.

It had to be a hard sell. The Gospels themselves speak of the tensions in sharing the Easter message. In the original ending of Mark, no one does tell! The women hear the words of the angel, and they run away terrified and tell no one. Luke includes the story of the travelers to Emmaus, both at a loss for what they have experienced, but then a helpful stranger calls them to understanding by unfolding the Scriptures. And then that stranger reveals himself as the Risen Christ!

The story we call central to our faith is a beautiful, powerful, transformative story. But it is also a foolish one. It is a foolish one because it defies regular explanation. And it is not just the resurrection that makes no sense. It is also foolish to follow a man who was condemned to death for crimes against the state and against the religious status quo.

Can you imagine how absurd it was to live through that story? To be the disciples and have the fear of all they went through leading up to the crucifixion, then having to face the devastating loss of their friend and the man they thought was the Messiah, only to have the uncanny surprise of Easter morning? It is no wonder that Peter, even after encountering Christ resurrected, decided to go back to fishing — at least at first."

Sometimes I do have people ask me, "If it all turns out to just be a story, if it isn't true that Jesus rose from the grave, how will you feel about your life then? Will you have lived your life as a fool because you gave your life to this Gospel?" Usually this question comes from a practicing atheist who insists their way is correct. The way I see it, the result is the same whether atheism or Christianity is true. Either way I have lived as a fool, but as a follower of Christ my foolishness is that I have loved people. Imperfect people. Selfish people. Hurting people. Angry people. Gifted people. Poor people. Rich people. Different people. People like me. What a foolish thing to do with my time?!?! And what an incredible life it will have been. And all of it is inspired by the story of Jesus Christ.

So, bring on the foolishness, whether it is April 1 or not! May you and I always love as foolishly as Jesus loved, and may we always have each other along as companions in this life of Foolish Love!

Alleluia! Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen Indeed!



#### FINANCIAL UPDATE

At Cayce, we practice a faith-based budget. What this means is the finance committee begins looking at the new year with prayer. What are the ministries and missions of the church? What is God calling us to in this new year? The committee also looks at last year's spending and budget and with great prayer sets a plan. This means that our budget is not finalized before January 1, in fact it is mid-March as I write this, and we do not have a finalized budget yet. I know, that's a big leap of faith to operate without a set budget, yet this is the way of faith and tradition at Cayce UMC. We have no guarantees except God. God has promised to be with us and we promise to listen and be faithful, frugal stewards.

In 2024, we are continuing to be faithful, frugal stewards. Our phenomenal staff continue to operate ministry on minimal budgets. And we continue to do good, meaningful and expansive ministry and missions. We fundraise to support ministries like children's and youth ministry. We ask for lunch money for the Senior luncheons. The office is no longer printing in color. We did fundraising for the music ministry Christmas cantata. We, as a church family, are taking on more cleaning duties and policing our own trash and footprint on the building. We have the most amazing volunteers who tend to the yard and maintenance of the church building. We look for grants, last week we got a \$500 grant for children's ministry. Lastly, the trustees are working, with church council's approval, to sell the church bus.

Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) and Finance have made adjustments to several positions in the church. With Cal retiring, the church hired a payroll company and Cynthia Hutchison, office administrator will take on much of the financial record keeping of the church. For our audio-visual needs on Sunday, we had a 2 year grant that helped us update the sound and video system and hire a staff. Sadly, the grant is completed and we are shifting to a more volunteer-based model for Sunday mornings. Volunteers needed, no experience required! The new model will empower and equip volunteers to run the ministry and outreach that is our Sunday morning livestream. We must acknowledge and thank Lisa for her devoted, faithful work in her time as our Audio-visual media specialist. Thank you Lisa.

So, what does this mean for the church? As it always has, tithing matters, giving to the general budget matters. And, giving of one's time and talents matters. Supporting fundraising matters. Your finance committee, SPRC committee and staff team are prayerfully working hard to ensure that every single penny squeaks and every dollar stretches. We are dreaming about ways to missionize or monetize our building. We are seeking grants and gifts. We are praying and listening.

In 2024, we will be regularly sharing on all platforms about money to show what mighty things God continues to do with our financial faithfulness. It was said at our last church council meeting that our future at Cayce UMC is bright. It is.

## S.C. bishop, delegation call for season of prayer leading up to General Conference

In April, United Methodists from around the world will gather in Charlotte, North Carolina, for the postponed 2020 General Conference. Much has gone into the preparations for this global assembly, and significant work is before delegates and church leaders when they meet April 23-May 3.

As we journey through Lent toward the cross and the promise of resurrection, South Carolina Resident Bishop L. Jonathan Holston and the South Carolina Conference Delegation to General Conference are Inviting all South Carolina United Methodists to join them each evening for "24 for '24," a season of focused, daily prayer for the 24 days leading up to the General Conference held in 2024.

When we join together in prayer each day, we remember who we are and whose we are as disciples of Jesus Christ," Holston said. "Each day we have the opportunity to be for someone the Gospel that they may never otherwise hear. We cannot avoid uncertainty, but we can respond with faith rather than fear. "Together each day, let us come together in prayer, trusting that God hears every word."

Beginning March 30, Holston and delegation members will share a video prayer at 8:24 p.m. (a.k.a., 20:24) praying for the church and specifically for groups of people who have been preparing for General Conference and who will participate and attend.

"I can tell you from experience, intentional prayer matters to those of us who attend General Conference," said Jackie Jenkins, lay delegate and head of the South Carolina Delegation. "We know you are lifting us up, and we are grateful that you keep us in your prayers without ceasing. "Please know that you and all South Carolina United Methodists are in our prayers, as well."

South Carolina's delegates are preparing for General Conference by praying and studying the voluminous legislation that will come before them when they meet in Charlotte. "Our delegates have been diligent in their preparations," said the Rev. Ken Nelson, clergy delegate and superintendent of the Orangeburg District. "We have been conversing with other delegates from across the connection, really thinking through the implications of the legislation so we will be better prepared to make the best decisions for the future of our beloved United Methodist Church during General Conference. As we have patiently waited these four years for General Conference, much of the public spotlight has been cast on the issue of human sexuality, and rightly so. But there are a great number of other important matters that need our prayerful attention, and it also is our responsibility to be as prepared to tend to those." The daily evening prayers will be shared via Facebook (@scumc), Instagram (@umcsc) and X (@umcsc), and by email to all who are signed up to receive conference news emails (https://umcsc.org/mailing-list-signup). They also will be posted at https://umcsc.org/24for24.
